(Mark 12:42–44)

3. The Sacrificial Giver – David

David refused to offer to God something that cost him nothing, showing that true giving involves sacrifice.
(2 Samuel 24:24)

4. The Voluntary Giver – Zacchaeus

Zacchaeus willingly gave generously to others without being forced or pressured.
(Luke 19:1–9)

5. The Reward-Seeking Givers

Some gave publicly to gain praise and recognition from people rather than to honor God. Jesus warned against such giving.
(Matthew 6:2)

GOD'S GREATEST GIFT

The greatest example of giving is God Himself. God gave humanity the best heaven could offer — His Son, Jesus Christ — for the salvation of the world.

Hebrews 9:11–14

Christ offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for our redemption and reconciliation with God.
